Maths

This half term we will be following a unit on Dance.

Homework

Spellings homework will be sent out every Friday. This homework is compulsory and needs to be brought back in to school please by the following Friday. The homework booklet is optional and will help your child learn more about their topics.

<u>Reading</u>

All children will take part in Whole Class Reading sessions on Fridays as well as individual reading. It is expected that all children read their individual books at home at least 4 times weekly. Please fill in the reading records to show us what you have worked on/read at home.

Top tips for reading with your child:

- Discuss the meaning of words to expand their knowledge of vocabulary in order to understand texts.
- Identify key aspects of fiction and non-fiction texts, such as characters, events,
 titles and information.
 - Identify and explain the sequence of events in texts.
 - Make inferences to the text (reading between the lines using their own knowledge and evidence from the text).
 - Predict what might happen on the basis of what has been read so far.
